Rules and Guidelines

I. Purpose

The BBFAA Educational Grant program is designed to encourage High School Graduates to pursue an associate, bachelor or graduate/postgraduate degree. The number and amount of grants awarded depends on available funding and on the number of qualified applicants.

This educational grant is named after Pilar Ramirez Hinchcliffe, past officer and active member who encouraged community participation and education. She exemplified and believed in the Filipino spirit of kaisahan (unity), bayanihan (cooperation) and damayan (involvement).

II. Requirements and Eligibility

- a. Who can apply?
 - i. High school seniors or undergraduate college students (up to junior/rising senior status) of <u>all ethnic backgrounds</u> who plan to pursue an associate's or bachelor's degree are encouraged to apply.
 - ii. Students must reside within the Big Bend area of Florida, which includes Franklin, Gadsden, Jefferson, Leon, Liberty, Madison, Taylor and Wakulla counties.
 - iii. Past awardees may reapply annually.
- b. Evaluation criteria
 - i. Applicants may apply by submitting a TikTok video or writing an essay that addresses the annual topic or question.
 - ii. Applicants must choose to apply for the Essay entry <u>**OR**</u> the TikTok entry. <u>Applicants cannot apply for both</u>.
 - iii. Applicants must apply for the subcategory listed under the Essay entry or TikTok entry that corresponds to the applicant's current education status. For instance, high school seniors who are submitting an essay should answer the question listed under the "high school" subcategory. And college students who plan to submit a TikTok entry should follow the rules listed under the "college" subcategory.
 - iv. For more specific details on submitting your entry, please refer to the evaluation criteria guidelines for TikTok submissions or the evaluation criteria guidelines for Essay submissions which follows the Rules and Guidelines section.
- c. Application
 - i. Completed application form (attached) and transcript along with submission of evaluative criteria.
 - 1. High School Students

- a. Include proof of acceptance to an accredited college or university. This must be an original letter (or copy) on college or university stationery from the admissions office or the registrar.
- b. Official High School Transcript (Senior Year, with current GPA)
 - i. While an unofficial high school transcript can be submitted at the time of submission, an <u>official</u> high school transcript must be submitted prior to the announcement of the finalists.
- c. Proof of acceptance/registration from the University/College.
- 2. College Students, currently enrolled
 - a. Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
 - b. An official, original transcript from your college, university, or institution of higher learning
 - i. While an unofficial college transcript can be submitted at the time of submission, an <u>official</u> college transcript must be submitted prior to the announcement of the finalists.
 - c. For college students, proof of enrollment.

III. Deadline

a. The deadline to submit all of your forms and documents is **March 31, 2022** by 11:59 pm ET.

IV. Notification of Award Recipients

- a. Winners will be announced on the Big Bend Filipino-American Association, Inc. Facebook profile and posted on the BBFAA website: BBFAA.org. The date of announcement will be determined.
- b. The TikTok video link will be posted on the BBFAA.org website and the BBFAA Facebook profile.
- c. The panel of TikTok Contest Judges will select the winners based on a criteria set by BBFAA.

V. Grant Allocation

- a. Grant awards are awarded in June and are valid for one year.
- b. A check in the amount of \$500 will be sent to the college or university bursar in the following September in the student's name.
- c. Grants may be used to pay for tuition or textbook costs related to the degree program.

Evaluation Criteria Guidelines for Essay Submissions

1. Write an original essay for the following topic:

According to *Stop AAPI Hate*, about one in five Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders experienced an incidence of hate between 2020-2021. In addition, they found that Asian Americans who only have a high school education reported experiencing twice the number of hate incidents (41.2%) as compared to those with some college (19.8%) and those who have earned a bachelor's degree or higher (13.8%).

Given these facts along with the recent incidents of violence and racial attacks toward Asians, what can be done to de-escalate the racial hostility against Asian Americans? In what ways can your suggestion(s) help to change such attitudes? Do you expect that change will take place overnight? Why or why not? And how do your suggestions support BBFAA's motto of kaisahan (unity), bayanihan (cooperation), and damayan (involvement)? Elaborate and provide examples to help illustrate your point(s).

- a. High school subcategory
 - i. High school seniors are required to write a 600-800 word original essay answering the question above.
- b. College subcategory
 - i. College students are required to write an 800-1,000 word original essay answering the question above. *In addition,* college students are also required to address the following question:

In your opinion and based on your observation(s)/experience(s), do you believe that college campuses and universities have taken action to support Asian and Pacific Islander students? Have these actions been effective? Could more be done? Explain.

- 2. Your essay must be formatted as follows:
 - a. Double-spaced.
 - b. 12-point Times New Roman font.
 - c. 1" inch margins (top and bottom, left and right).
 - d. MUST follow a citation style (eg, APA, MLA, Chicago Style, etc).
 - e. Title page with title, name, educational institution, and email address.
 - f. Page numbers.
 - g. Essay must follow appropriate word count (as noted in section 1a or 1b above), excluding title page, reference list, and page numbers.

- 3. Essays will be judged on:
 - a. Quality and comprehensive nature of the essay, including supporting details.
 - b. Organization of paper.
 - c. Basic editing/proofreading of paper (e.g., syntax and grammatical errors).
 - d. Originality. Note: Essays that have been plagiarized will automatically be disqualified.
- 4. Grant recipient/awardee will be announced on the Big Bend Filipino-American Association, Inc. Facebook profile and posted on the BBFAA website: BBFAA.org. The date of announcement will be determined.
- 5. The deadline for submissions is **March 31, 2022.**

Evaluation Criteria Guidelines for TikTok Video Submissions

- 1. Creating your TikTok video:
 - a. Create a brief, solo TikTok video on performing arts. It can include any of the following formats: Dancing, singing, drama, instrumental music, poetry, etc. Your performance should reflect some aspect of Filipino culture <u>and</u> promote the goals of the BBFAA organization. The video genre can be classic, traditional, or pop culture but it has to demonstrate an aspect of Filipino culture <u>and</u> promote the goals of the BBFAA organization.  - b. Time limit
 - i. High school subcategory
 - TikTok video must be no longer than 3 minutes.
 - ii. College subcategory
 - TikTok video must be no longer than 1.5 minutes.
 - c. Rules:
 - i. The video must not be offensive or violate any of TikTok's community guidelines, or it will be disqualified.
 - ii. The TikTok video must reflect or express some aspect of Filipino culture.
 - iii. The TikTok video should promote the goals of the BBFAA organization.
 - iv. The TikTok video must focus on some type of performing art as mentioned above.
 - v. It <u>must</u> be a TikTok video. No other type of format will be accepted.
 - vi. The **<u>correct</u>** TikTok video link must be submitted so that it can be viewed.
 - vii. The link submitted must be available for viewing at the time of submission.
 - viii. Only TikTok videos with solo acts qualify. TikTik videos with group acts will <u>not</u> be considered.
 - ix. A signed parental consent form must accompany the application if the Entrant is under 18 years of age.
 - d. Grant recipient/awardee will be announced on the Big Bend Filipino-American Association, Inc. Facebook profile and posted on the BBFAA website: BBFAA.org. The date of announcement will be determined.
 - e. The TikTok video link will be posted on the BBFAA.org website and the BBFAA Facebook profile.
 - f. The panel of TikTok Contest Judges will select the winners based on a criteria set by BBFAA.

- g. The deadline to submit all of your forms and documents is **March 31, 2022**.
- 2. For the TikTok URL...
 - a. Tag your TikTok video with the following: #BBFAA2022
 - b. Provide your TikTok profile name.
 - c. Include a description of your video as noted in the application form.
- 3. Complete, sign, and include the consent form with your application form.
 - a. If you are under 18 years of age, you <u>must</u> have your parent or legal guardian sign the parental consent waiver form and include it with your completed application.
